Deuteronomy - “The Book of Remembrance”

God’s words delivered through Moses to the Children of Israel to bring to their “Remembrance” why and how they are where they are and where they are going.

Deut. 6:1 Now these *are* the commandments, the statutes, and the judgments, which the LORD your God commanded to teach you, that ye might do *them* in the land whither ye go to possess it:

Deuteronomy - “The Book of Remembrance”

English title meaning - “Second Law” from *17:18*

Hebrew title is – “These are the Words” 1st two words

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

"Those who can not remember the past are condemned to repeat it." George Santayana (1905)

Those who cannot learn from history are doomed to repeat it

Those who do not read history are doomed to repeat it.

Those who do not remember their past are condemned to repeat their mistakes.

Those who fail to learn from the mistakes of their predecessors are destined to repeat them.

Deuteronomy - “The Book of Remembrance”

A.T. Pierson was the preacher who said; “History is His story”

The Bible is a living drama that reveals the living God Who loves His creation and His desire that they will come know Him.

Deuteronomy reveals this great truth as no other book in the Old Testament. It is quoted almost 100 times in the New Testament books and Jesus quoted Deuteronomy more than any other book in the Old Testament.

Deuteronomy - “The Book of Remembrance”

The Reverend John Newton the writer of “Amazing Grace” at the age of 82 wrote, “My memory is nearly gone, but I remember two things: that I am a great sinner, and that Christ is a great Saviour.”

1 Corinthians 10:6 Now these things (what happened to Israel) were our examples, to the intent we should not lust after evil things, as they also lusted.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important:

1. *Deut. 8:18* But thou shalt remember the LORD thy God: for *it is* He that giveth thee power to get wealth, that He may establish His covenant which He sware unto thy fathers, as *it is* this day.

1 Timothy 3:16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important:

2. *Deut. 5:15* And remember that thou wast a servant (slave) in the land of Egypt, and *that* the LORD thy God brought thee out thence through a mighty hand and by a stretched out arm: therefore the LORD thy God commanded thee to keep the sabbath day

Romans 7:18 For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but *how* to perform that which is good I find not.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important:

2. *Deut. 5:15* And remember that thou wast a servant (slave) in the land of Egypt, and that the LORD thy God brought thee out ...

Romans 7:24 O wretched man that I am! who shall deliver me from the body of this death?

25 I thank God through Jesus Christ our Lord. So then with the mind I myself serve the law of God; but with the flesh the law of sin.

Deuteronomy - “The Book of Remembrance”

Remembering what’s really important:

3. *Deut. 8:2* And thou shalt remember all the way which the LORD thy God led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee, to know what was in thine heart, whether thou wouldest keep his commandments, or no.

Philippians 2:13 For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of *His* good pleasure.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important:

4. *Deut. 25:17* Remember what Amalek (enemies) did unto thee by the way, when ye were come forth out of Egypt;

1 John 2:15 Love not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

16 For all that *is* in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important:

5. *Deut. 32:7* Remember the days of old, consider the years of many generations: ask thy father, and he will shew thee; thy elders, and they will tell thee.

1 Thess. 5:12 And we beseech you, brethren, to know them which labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you;

Heb 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

2. For by it the elders obtained a good report.

Deuteronomy - "The Book of Remembrance"

Remembering what's really important by Application:

Deut. 6:5 And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.

6 And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:

7 And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.
